- 8th grade Star Math and Star Reading scores
- Lexile Scores (language arts, science, social studies)
- Class Assessments and Grades (all subjects)
- Teacher Recommendation
- Parent Waiver Permitted



The goal of 8th Grade Math is to prepare students for Algebra 1 with opportunities to demonstrate mastery solving Algebra based problems like multi-step equations, slope and functions.



## 8th Grade Science

Science consists of a way of thinking and investigating, as well as a growing body of knowledge about the natural world. To become literate in science, students need to possess sufficient understanding of fundamental science content knowledge, the ability to engage in the science and engineering practices, and to use scientific and technological information correctly.

## 8th Grade Science

#### Resources:

Students will use several resources, such as google classroom, discovery education, quizlet, and PHET simulations. These are used to provide students with an opportunity to master physical science concepts and develop skills through assignments, activities, projects, games, flashcards, and practice quizzes.

#### District and State Assessments:

Students will take 3 to 4 common district 4 4 assessments and the End of Grade Georgia Milestones Assessment.

## 8th Grade Social Studies

Students will trace the history of Georgia in the context of the development of the United States. A chronological approach includes the foundation of Georgia from prehistoric times to the twentieth century, including Georgia's geography, history, government, and economics. The Common Core Georgia Performance Standards are our driving force in 8th grade social studies.

## 8th Grade Social Studies

### Assessments:

- Unit Test Those who fail (below a 70%) unit tests are required to complete test corrections or unit review questions.
- Common Assessments These are given each quarter and the assessment results will be compared between schools!
- EOG (End of Grade) The cumulative GA Milestone assessment will be given near the end of the school year. This is the first time your student has taken a Social Studies EOG in several years!

### Housekeeping:

- Organization is KEY. Because we do not use a textbook regularly, your student's "textbook" is comprised of handouts and resources given by the teacher.
- At this time, all students should have a folder to house their materials.

## 8th Grade World Language

Mme Keeney Sra. Chong

Advanced French and Spanish at CHMS are 2-year long classes that cover the entirety of the Level I high school World Language course.

The curriculum is determined by the respective textbooks for each language.

Spanish: Realidades Level 1 from Prentice Hall

French: D'accord! Level 1 from Vista Higher Learning

Because World Language replaces a student's Reading class, students in Advanced World Language are responsible for reading AR books and taking AR tests in this class. Students should be reading for at least 30 minutes at home every day.

## High School Credit

Upon meeting the criteria bulleted below, your student will begin high school with the second year of a world language. Beginning World Language in middle school affords Douglas County students the opportunity to develop skills needed to meet the demands of the twenty-first century and continue to a higher proficiency level with advanced high school world language study.

In order to automatically receive this high school credit, your student must:

 Have a passing World Language yearly average for his/her seventh grade year.

#### AND

 Have an 80 or above yearly average in his/her eighth grade year.

## High School Credit cont.

What happens if a student does not finish with an 80 average for the year?

If your student finishes the year with an overall average between 70 and 79 in World Language, you will have the option to determine whether or not you wish your student to receive the high school credit.



If you choose to have your student receive the credit, then he/she will be placed into World Language II, but keep in mind that the final 8th grade average will be the grade used on the transcript for forwarding credit to high schools in Douglas County and for GPA purposes. I.e. your student will start high school with a C on his/her transcript.
